- 4. Summer Workshop 2020 organized by UMAR / UIA region II / SADAS-PEA/ UIA Greek Section under the theme: "Sustainable Designs: Natural Building Techniques" at the Stourna Hostel at Pilion Mountain, Volos, Central Greece postponed for a safer time
- 5. 4th congress "Architecture & Tourism" at Rhodes Island Organized by architects of Rhodes, UIA region II / SADAS-PEA/ UIA Greek Section with the following Sub-themes: 1. Thematic Tourism. 2. Sustainable Design - Ecological Architecture. 3. Award-winning (whether implemented or not) tourism related project. 4. Relation of Natural Resources and Infrastructure to Tourism Development. Papers and PPs were selected but the congress postponed for later
- 6. The "International Open Ideas Competition for the Design of the surrounding area of the Ancient Theater of Larissa, Greece" According to UNESCO-UIA international competitions and town planning regulations will be, hopefully, announced in APRIL. The area was hit a few days ago of a number of earthquakes with more 1000 buildings destroyed
- 7. The International Architectural Competition (2 phases) for the re-design of Thessaloniki International fair Conf_ex, under the auspices of UIA-UNESCO regulations is at the second phase and the projects of the 15 teams selected from 116 submitted will be finished at the end of July (hopefully).

Here I have to express my appreciation and thanks to all support and continuous help offered by the UIA-ICC directors Regina Gonthier and Jerzy Grochulski in developing and finalize the above competitions

- 8. UIA Greek section organized two mini webinars to discuss matters that are connected to coronavirus: "the experience of the pandemic"
- 9. Also in few days we organize a webinar under the title "Conditions created by pandemic health protocols and their impact on public / private space"
- 10. The UIA Greek section is happy to support and is very much willing to help the Georgian architects in organizing the virtual exhibition they have suggested which will be a very important event under such circumstances (hybrid digital)
- 11. As member of UIA-PHG I inform you that the UIA-PHG RIO Congress 2021 CALL FOR NEW PAPERS AND PROJECTS after a challenging year of dealing with COVID. The two themes for the UIA-PHG 2021 Seminar are: 1) Health and Cities, and 2) Architecture for Health. As member of the Education Committee I Inform you that the EDUCOM had two meetings to revise the UNESCO-UIA Charter for architectural education with emphasis on issues of sustainability and the environment, architectural heritage, pedagogical methods, creativity in relation to new technologies and so on.

13. Finally I announce that I will be a candidate for the UIA Council decided by Greece. Very shortly I Joined UIA Greek section in the mid 80's and almost at the same time UIA-PHG.
